# Federal Student Loan Pause Expires August 31, 2023

### Federal student loan payment and interest pause is set to expire on August 31, 2023. Prepare now for payments to resume.

#### Your student loan servicer may have changed.

- Log in to <u>StudentAid.gov/login</u> to verify your servicer.
- Find the "My Aid" section and select "View loan servicer details."
- Or, call the Federal Student Aid Information Center (FSAIC) at 1-800-4-FED-AID (1-800-433-3243).

#### Your repayment options may have changed.

- Use Loan Simulator at <u>StudentAid.gov/loan-simulator</u> to make sure you're in the best repayment plan.
- Take advantage of a possible discount on your interest rate.
- Direct Loan borrowers who use auto-debit get a 0.25% interest rate deduction on their loans.

You may be eligible for the Maryland Student Loan Tax Credit from the Maryland Higher Education Commission, if you are a Maryland taxpayer who maintained Maryland residency for the 2023 tax year.

- Applications are open July 1, 2023 through September 15, 2023.
